Delmarva Birds and Wallops



The Delmarva Peninsula is home to great variety of birds ranging from the humble shorebird to the mighty eagle. Bald Eagles (Haliaeetus leucocephaluare) are found across North America. Many favor coastal regions and wetlands, including those found on Delmarva. Bald Eagles are known to travel great distances of hundreds of miles or more (usually approximately 250 miles) to search for good habitats to nest. Once a suitable nesting site is found, the birds typically stay in this location year round.

Ironically, this average 250 mile distance is the same approximate distance that the International Space Station (ISS) orbits above the surface of Earth each day.

In contrast, the trumpeter swan (*Cygnus buccinator*) and tundra swan (Cygnus columbianus) are known to migrate hundreds of miles between sub-arctic or arctic climate zones in the summer to temperate zones in the winter every year as the seasons change. Coincidentally, the swan is the





symbol of the Cygnus Spacecraft, whose name means, "swan" in Greek. Ironically, one could say both the Cygnus Spacecraft and swans share a similar

"migratory" instinct, since both fly from Delmarva to their respective destinations each year.
