Build a Mason Bee Home

Mason bees are extremely important for pollinating fruit trees like

apples and cherries and are often referred to as orchard bees. Six mason bees can pollinate an entire fruit-tree; it would take 360 honey bees to pollinate the same tree.

Use a solid structure for your bee home. An old can, wooden crate, or an old bird house will work nicely.

In the front opening, tightly fill the area with twigs, cardboard nesting tubes, dead washed up marsh wrack, or cut bamboo.

Build a tiny roof structure, attach the home to a solid foundation (tree, porch, plywood), and enjoy your new little bee buddies



Energy Saving Tips by Ed Baca



- Vacuum the registers and vents of your duct system to dramatically improve their efficiency.
- Use light dimmers. Check compact florescent bulbs for compatibility with dimmer switches.
- Inspect all ductwork for any air leakage. If there is air leaking at the joints, use silver metal duct tape to seal them. Heating cost savings could be up to 10%.

Here Are Some Important Chemical Safety Do's and Don'ts:

- DO always read and understand the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for every chemical you will use.
- DO always wear protective gloves and goggles when recommended on the SDS.
- **DON'T** put used or spilled chemicals back into the original container.
- **DO** store chemicals in their originally labelled containers and make sure they are closed properly.
- **DO** always wash your hands after handling chemicals.
- **DON'T** store or use chemicals near food/ drinks, food storage areas, or any tools or equipment that will touch food/drinks.
- **DO** ensure you have a Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (COSHH) for cleaning chemicals.
- **DON'T** mix chemicals together as this can cause harmful fumes or other reactions.

Two key reference documents:

- GPR 1700.8B "GSFC Hazard Communication Program"
- GPS 4100.2C "Hazardous Material Data Management"

<u>Common Issues Found During Recent</u> Walkthroughs:

Secondary container missing labels or information on labels.

GPR 1700.8B - "Portable containers (all secondary containers), into which chemicals are transferred from label (primary) should be clearly labeled with the identity of the hazardous material and either a signal word; hazard statement(s); pictogram(s); or precautionary statement(s)."

 Storage or container left out-Each work center has a chemical storage location that the area inventory is based on.



- All chemical containers need to be returned after use to the proper storage location as defined in the inventory for the workspace.
- GPR 1700.8B Section 1.4(g): "All GSFC personnel: Should properly

store hazardous materials per SDS recommendations"

- Open drink or food containers in work areas
 where chemicals are being used.
- Osha 29 CFR 1910.141(g)(2): "Eating and drinking areas. No employee shall be allowed to consume food or beverages in a toilet room nor in any area exposed to toxic material."
