#### How to Report Stranded WFF Recreational Beach Animals

#### **Wallops Island Protected Species**

If you see a stranded marine mammal (dolphin, seal, whale, etc.) or sea turtle, contact

It is illegal to harm or harass threatened and endangered species and marine mammals.

DO NOT approach the animal. Stay at least 150 feet away.

If no response, Recreational Beach users are encouraged to call Security at the Wallops Island Gate (757) 824-2780, if they spot any protected species.







#### Loggerhead Sea Turtle Fun Facts

- Loggerheads are named for their overly proportioned head.
- Post hatchlings feed on jelly animals and sea slugs.
- An adult's strong jaws allow it to crush crab and snail shells.
- ♦ Adults can weigh from 155 to 375 pounds.
- Females take about an hour to dig a body pit and egg chamber, lay eggs, and scatter sand to hide their nest.
- Adults can live over 60 years.





#### **Outside Electrical Work**

- Have a qualified electrician do all electrical work.
- To prevent an electrical shock, make sure all your outside electrical receptacles are GFCI (groundfault circuit interrupter) protected.

#### **Equipment Safety**

- Use lighting and power tools that are listed by a qualified test laboratory and make sure they are made for outdoor use.
- Store your electrical tools indoors.
- Keep electric tools away from children.
- Keep the area around your electric meter and other electrical equipment clear.
- Check lighting and extension cords for damage before using. Replace any damaged cords right away.
- Use extention cords that are listed by a qualified test laboratory and are marked for outdoor use.
- Extension cords are not meant for long-term use.

## POWER LINES

Have a professional tree cutting service trim branches that might fall on electric wiring. Use a wooden or fiberglass ladder outside. Keep the ladder at least 10 feet away from power lines. Never touch anyone or anything in contact with a downed wire. Power lines may be live, stay a safe distance away. Report downed wires to authorities right away.

#### IMPORTANT REMINDER

Call "Before You Dig" (8-1-1) before any digging on your property. They will mark where your underground utilities are located. It's a free service!
