

2: Two additional containers totaling 2,194 lbs were generated in 2019 but shipped in 2020. This is why the weight doesn't match, relative to slide 2 (4,494 lbs), for antifreeze from generators at 24C (CLT-AFZ-004).

Pollution Prevention

- Pollution Prevention efforts have improved since the implementation of the hazardous materials management system (HMMS) and the Chemical Reuse Center.
- Four 4 liter bottles and four 1 liter bottles of methanol were issued to the Ocean Ecology Lab (Bldg. 22-C283) on January 22, 2020.
- Four 1 pint bottles of ethanol were issued to the code 240 (Bldg. 9-015) protective services for COVID-19 decontamination on April 20, 2020.
- Ten 1 pint bottles of ethanol were issued to the code 670 (Bldg. 21 rooms C023 & 233) for lab/COVID-19 decontamination on July 21, 2020.
- 1 gallon of Aeroglaze Z306 coating was received on October 1, 2020 as part of a lab clean out in Bldg. 34. MEMD was able to receive it and issue it back out to Bldg. 5-195A coatings lab on the same day.
- 100 mL of tert-butylamine was mistakenly ordered by code 545. Code 270 reached out to MEMD and needed it picked up from the shipping and receiving warehouse on December 1, 2020. MEMD queried HMMS and was able to find a user at a lab in Bldg. 34-C174A and transfer it for reuse on the same day.

HMMS: 10 years of Waste Data at GSFC

2020 marks a decade since the first GSFC waste container was entered into HMMS. Below are some trends over the last 10 years.

- The DDL, Plating Shop, Pre Clean, and the two heating and refrigeration plants round out the top five hazardous waste generators at GSFC.
- The top five hazardous wastes at GSFC were mixed non-chlorinated solvents, nonchlorinated solvent wipes, bulk caustic waste, the Bldg. 24 chiller chemical cleaning, and piranha/SC2 cleaner from the DDL.
- GSFC generates on average about 37,000 lbs. of hazardous waste per year.
- December, June and October are when our heaviest shipments occur. November and January were the months with the least amount of weight shipped.
